Cooking Through the Calendar

April–Lentil Sloppy Joes


Ingredients:

- 1 Tbsp. Olive Oil
- 1 medium bell pepper, chopped 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 small onion, c 1/2 cup water
- 1 cup low-sodium vegetable broth
- 1 cup dried lentils
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 can (6 oz.) tomato paste
- 1/3 cup ketchup
- 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce (optional)
- 2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 Tbsp. chili powder
- 1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard (or yellow)
- 8 whole wheat hamburger buns

Directions:

- 1. Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Wash fresh produce under cool running water, using a vegetable brush to scrub veggies with a firm surface. Dry and cut to prepare for this recipe.
- 3. Over medium heat, add oil to a medium-sized pot. Saute bell pepper and onions until softened, about 4 minutes.
- 4. Add water, broth and lentils. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer.
- 5. Cover and cook for 25 minutes.
- 6. Stir in garlic powder, tomato paste, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, chili powder and mustard.
- 7. Enjoy the finished sloppy joe mixture on a bun.
- 8. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.
